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<u>5</u>	2019-2020 State Budget - Funding of Interest to Valley Water

Continuous Improvement - Improved Respiratory Protection

Valley Water has recently added Powered Air-Purifying Respirators (PAPR's) to the list of personal protective equipment available to Valley Water employees. The purpose for this addition is to enhance respiratory protection for Valley Water employees who perform maintenance activities with a higher potential for exposure to airborne contaminants (such as applying industrial coatings and welding activities). Below is a list of the benefits associated with using this type of respiratory protection:

- PAPR's offer a higher level of protection compared to tight fitting filtering face piece respirators
- A PAPR system uses a blower instead of lung power to draw air through the filter which allows the user to breathe comfortably with less resistance, as the airflow is delivered directly into the headgear from the blower
- The continuous flow of air from the blower motor helps keep the user cool during high temperatures or strenuous activities and helps eliminate the face-shield lens from fogging up while working
- Loose fitting headgear on PAPR's do not require annual fit-testing, unlike a reusable filtering face piece respirator which requires the user to undergo annual fit-testing
- Users are able to wear their normal prescription eyeglasses under the PAPR and do not require specialized attachments or kits that tight fitting filtering face pieces require

The PAPR can be a great resource for the end user, as it will allow them to choose from a wide range of headgear and other options providing a customized solution that works best for their specific needs.

FY18 Annual Report of District Rental Property Income and Expenses

Valley Water acquires properties that are required for future Valley Water projects and programs. Prior to the commencement of these projects, Valley Water will seek to keep some of these properties occupied by leasing them at fair market rates, as per Board Resolution No. 09-78. The Resolution requires the CEO to provide a report each year on Valley Water's annual rental income and expenses of Valley Water properties. Below is the Fiscal Year 2018 (FY18) Annual Report of Valley Water Rental Property Income and Expenses.

In FY18, Valley Water managed a total of 114 properties: 61 non-residential and 53 residential properties. This represents 0 (zero) residential and non-residential property changes over FY17. The Total Net Income for FY18 increased by 4% (\$56,211) from the previous fiscal year from \$1.5 million to \$1.557 million.

Total Gross Income for FY18 increased by 6% (\$116,923) from \$1.928 million to \$2.045 million. The higher income resulted from rent increases on residential properties that turned over tenants and due to increased rental value after conducting an annual market review of rents. The total increase in income from residential properties was approximately 5% (\$80,150), from \$1,622,072 to \$1,702,222, and the income from non-residential properties increased by 11% (\$36,773) from \$306,026 to \$342,799.

Updates on Valley Water Recommendations for the Groundwater Benefit Zone Study

This past spring, Valley Water participated in a public engagement process and hosted a series of open houses for the public and well owners to learn more about the Groundwater Benefit Zone Study and the proposed benefit zones. Alongside the 2 (two) scheduled open houses for the North County and South County areas, an additional open house was hosted in South County in response to a mailing list database error. In addition, Valley Water met individually with interested stakeholders to explain the study results and its potential impacts. Valley Water received valuable input and site-specific information from well owners and amended the recommendations for the proposed zones.

Valley Water is currently conducting outreach to communicate these updates. The latest update mailer regarding the Groundwater Benefit Zones Study was sent last week to impacted stakeholders with more communications expected to continue this week and next. This is part of an ongoing commitment to being informative and transparent with Valley Water's public engagement process. Updated information on the recommended zones is also available at www.valleywater.org/gwbenefits. A Valley Water recommendation about the proposed benefit zones will be made to the Board of Directors toward the end of summer 2019 (tentatively scheduled for August 27).

Semitropic Groundwater Bank Update

Valley Water secured a commitment from Semitropic Groundwater Bank (Semitropic) to store 64,000 acre-feet of Valley Water's contract supplies in 2019. Since 1996, Valley Water has used

its contractual space in Semitropic to store some of its State Water Project and Central Valley Project contract water in wet and above normal years; this water is withdrawn in dry years to supplement contact with supplies that are typically diminished.

With 2019 allocations of State Water Project and Central Valley Project supplies to Valley Water being well above average, redirecting some of this water to Semitropic is an ideal strategy to optimize the long term usage of this water. An addition of 64,000 acre-feet this year will bring Valley Water's Semitropic storage amount up to full capacity at 350,000 acre-feet.

With an eye to the future benefits of the Semitropic program, Valley Water is monitoring to detect any possibility of operational changes that may be necessary under the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act. Valley Water will continue to monitor conditions and will provide updates to the Board as needed. Further, at its May 20, 2019, meeting, the Water Storage Exploratory Committee recommended that the Board receive an update on the Semitropic program. Valley Water is preparing to return to the Board with an agenda item on that subject in fall 2019.

2019-2020 State Budget - Funding of Interest to Valley Water

On Friday, June 27, 2019, Governor Gavin Newsom signed the 2019-2020 State Budget, adopting a spending plan of \$214.8 billion for the next fiscal year. As previously reported, the Governor continues to focus on addressing several high-profile issues including health care, housing, homelessness, education, and response to fire danger.

The State Budget includes \$1 billion in bonds from Proposition 68, The California Drought, Water, Parks, Climate, Coastal Protection, and Outdoor Access for All Act, approved by the voters in June 2018. Some significant Proposition 68 appropriations that are of interest to Valley Water include the following.

- \$168.5 million State Water Resources Control Board Water quality improvement and safe drinking water
- \$88 million Department of Water Resources Drought and groundwater investments
- \$74 million State Water Resources Control Board Water recycling grants and loans
- \$70 million Natural Resources Agency Voluntary Agreements
- \$35 million Wildlife Conservation Board Habitat and wildlife conservation
- \$25 million Department of Water Resources Floodplain Management, Protection and Risk Awareness Program
- \$22.1 million Water Conservation Board Natural Community Conservation Plans
- \$15 million State Coastal Conservancy Wetlands restoration in the Bay Area
- \$15 million Wildlife Conservation Board Wildlife corridor infrastructure projects
- \$7.6 million Department of Water Resources Urban Stream Restoration Program
- \$6 million Department of Fish and Wildlife Habitat restoration and protection

Also of interest is a \$130 million annual, continuous appropriation to the Safe Clean Water Fund to be created by SB 200 (Monning) and is intended to address the lack of safe and clean water in many communities throughout California. The funding was appropriated with \$100 million from the Green House Gas Reduction Fund (Cap and Trade proceeds) and \$30 million from the

General Fund. Valley Water supports SB 200, which is currently pending the Governor's signature.

Valley Water pursues state grant funding based on eligibility criteria, timing, and other factors to determine a project's suitability. Valley Water will work to determine when grants funded by the above appropriations will be available for application and consideration.

This item pertains to information on a recently completed CalPERS Office of Audit Services on Valley Water's employment of retired annuitants. Government Code section 21221, 21224, 21229, and 7522.56 provide that in a fiscal year, retired members may work a total of 960 for all employers combined without reinstatement to employment.

In November 2018, CalPERS conducted an audit or our hiring practices pertaining to the employment of CalPERS retired annuitants. Valley Water was one of 60 other agencies CalPERS retired annuitants with service retirement into the CalPERS system and accurately tracked and reported their hours to ensure the retired annuitants did not work more than 960 hours in a fiscal year.

Valley Water's audit was limited to review of a sample of retired annuitant records for the period July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2017, CalPERS requested the records of 30 individuals that Valley Water hired as temporary works during this period.

The audit results found that Valley Water did not fully complete the process of enrolling and/or reporting the hours of three (3) retired annuitants. One (1) retired annuitant exceeded the 960-hour limit by 24 hours in the fiscal year 2014-2015. The audit also pointed to five (5) retired annuitants that worked for Valley Water for multiple fiscal years. Government Code Section 7522.56 indicates that agencies can hire a retired annuitant without reinstatement to perform work of "limited duration." Valley Water responded to this observation with a letter to CalPERS stating that in the absence of a defined cap on the number of permitted hours in successive fiscal years, Valley Water implemented a Policy that attempted to capture the intent by limited retired annuitants to a *lifetime* total of 1920 hours (equivalent to two fiscal years/960hours each)

Since this audit was conducted, staff has made the required adjustments to enroll and report the hours of the retired annuitants identified. The retired annuitant that exceeded the 960-hour limit will be required to repay Valley Water the 24 hours in order to rectify the violation.

The results of this audit have been used to improve and streamline our processes to ensure that retired annuitants are now enrolled and reported to CalPERS timely and accurately.
