SUMMARY:

The District is launching a Public Arts Program to engage all sectors of the community and to be a part of the fabric and culture of the various communities it serves. Staff is proposing to utilize the existing interpretive benches that have been installed throughout the county as potential art projects to engage the community.

Program Overview

There are close to 200 interpretive benches installed throughout the county. Many of them have not been maintained and are in poor condition. The Adopt-A-Bench Art Project would allow the District to revitalize the benches by adding artwork inspired by the District's mission of safe, clean water; flood protection; and environmental stewardship. The District would solicit design ideas by releasing a request for proposal to the community. The Board of Directors would select final design ideas.

Pilot Program

Staff is proposing to pilot the Adopt-A-Bench Art Project with the Youth Commission. Should the Youth Commission approve to participate, commissioners would adopt the first seven benches - one bench per district. The commissioners would work with an art advisor to design the benches and the final design would go to the Board of Directors for approval. Once the Board approves, the commissioners would work with art advisor to paint the design on the bench.

Proposed Timeline:

December through February - Develop a design concept for the bench March - Present design concept to Board of Directors for approval April through May - Paint benches June - Unveiling events with each board member.

A few facts about the Synopsys Science Fair

- Students from schools all over the Santa Clara County take part in the Synopsys Championship by presenting science projects
- This science fair is for both middle- and high-school students
- The fair is divided into multiple areas of science: Environmental Science, Chemistry, Medicine & Health, Computer Science, Biology and more.
- Every student with a potential project is encouraged to apply for the Synopsys Fair, and it is a great learning experience for all involved!

When does the Synopsys Science Fair occur

• The Synopsys Science Fair of 2018 occurs Thursday, March 14th and takes place at the San Jose Convention Center in San Jose, California.

Why the Santa Clara Water District Youth Commission should be interested in the Synopsys Science Fair

- Water is not a very common project topic in the Synopsys Science Fair, and the amount of special awards given to (specifically) water projects is not very high
- Many judges for special awards are often quite knowledgeable of Engineering,
 Medical studies or Computer Science, but not so much of Water related topics
- Water is extremely important to our survival, therefore it's important for more students to be inspired about water
- We, as members of the Water District Youth Commission, can make a change to the Synopsys Science fair to promote more interest in cleaning and saving water

What the Water District can do to get involved in the Synopsys Science fair

- A few ideas we have of how the water district can become involved in the Synopsys Science Fair is:
- There can be prizes just for high-schoolers, or for both middle- and high-schoolers:
- For high-schoolers- 1st prize- \$150, 2nd prize- \$100, 3rd prize- \$75 = Total amount is \$325
- For middle-schoolers- 1st prize- \$100, 2nd prize- \$75, 3rd prize- \$50 = Total amount is \$225
- The total amount for both high- and middle-schoolers is \$550

What the Water District can do to get involved in the Synopsys Science fair cont.

- The monetary amounts for both the high-school and middle-school prizes can be changed depending on the financial constraints of the water district
- Students involved in the Santa Clara Valley Water District Youth Commission will not be judged on by any judges provided by the Santa Clara water district due to conflict of interest
- By providing special awards at Synopsys, the Santa Clara Water District will also bring more awareness to students of water-related issues
