Economics and Science of Recycled Water: Strategies for Commercial Viability.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

This is a discussion item and the Commission may provide comments, however, no action is required.

#### SUMMARY:

This will be a special presentation by Craig S. Criddle, Professor, Environmental Engineering & Science (EES) Senior Fellow, Woods Institute for the Environment, Stanford University. Professor Criddle will share his latest research on economic and science of recycled water and what the newest technologies mean for commercial viability and scale-up of recycling water. Design of recycled water systems is time-consuming, complex, and not transparent. We have developed a software toolkit that identifies water reuse configurations that meet key design objectives, such as maximizing revenue, maximizing recycled water delivery to customers, or maximizing recycled water delivery while ensuring a positive revenue. A case study will be used to show how these design features can be used to identify promising strategies for expansion of complex urban recycled water systems.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Commission Chair Kishimoto invited Professor Criddle to speak on recycled water and the environmental issues that the Water Commission discussed in 2018.

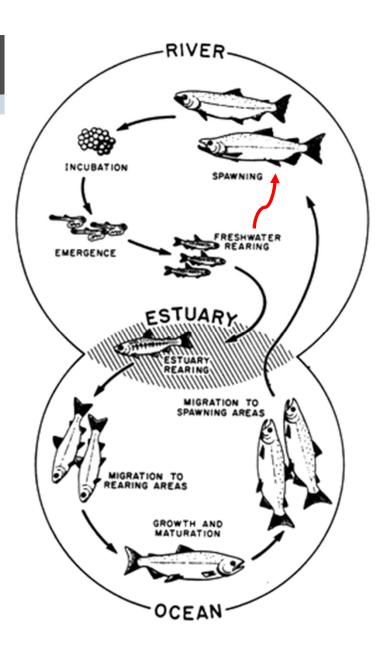

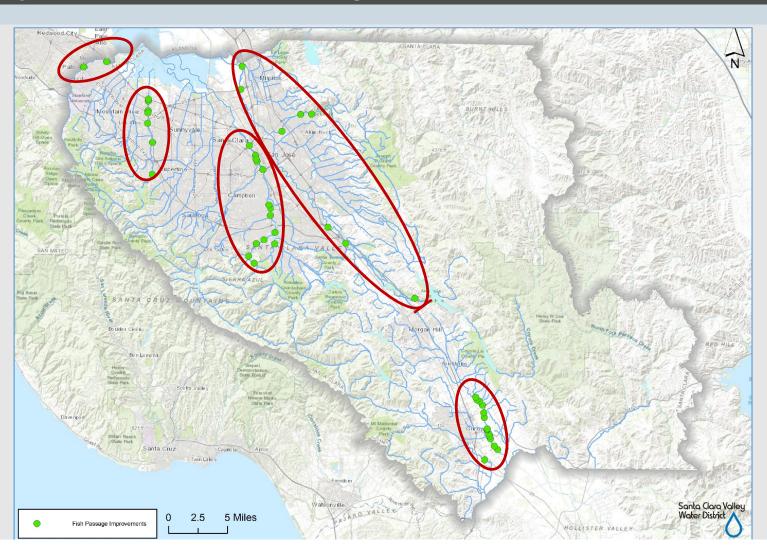

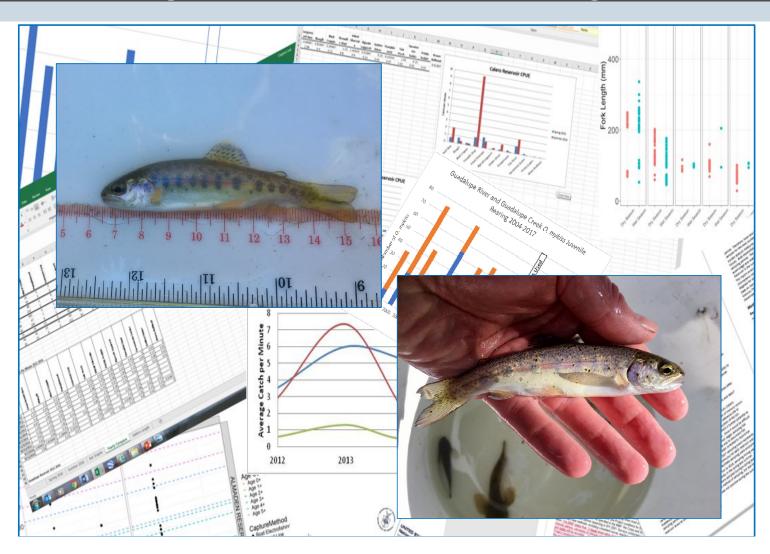

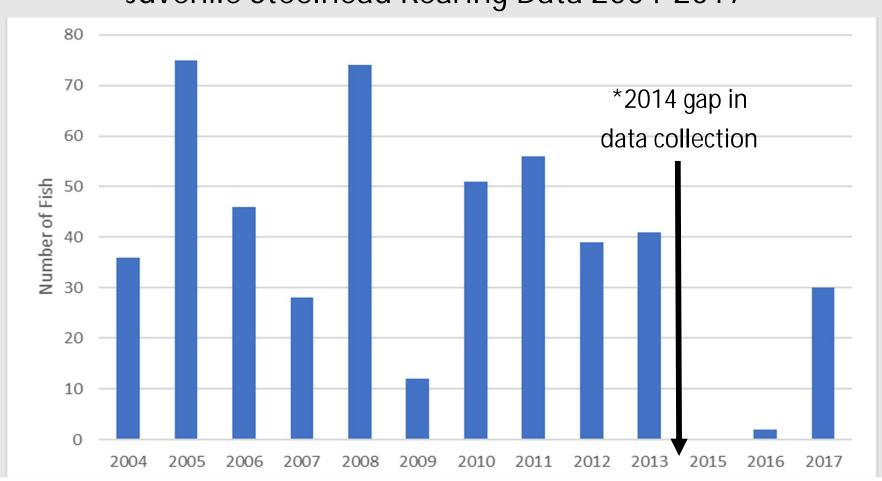

# Understanding Steelhead Monitoring Data



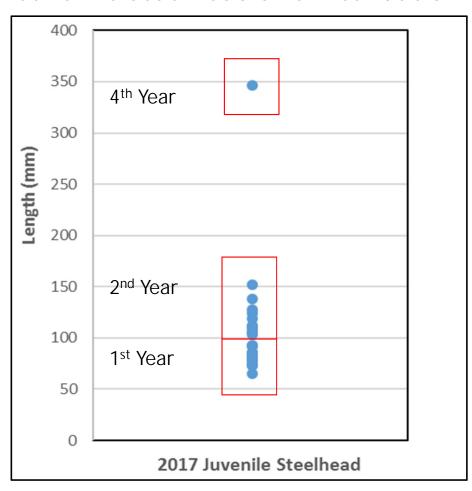
# Guadalupe Watershed Population Fluctuations

### Juvenile Steelhead Rearing Data 2004-2017\*



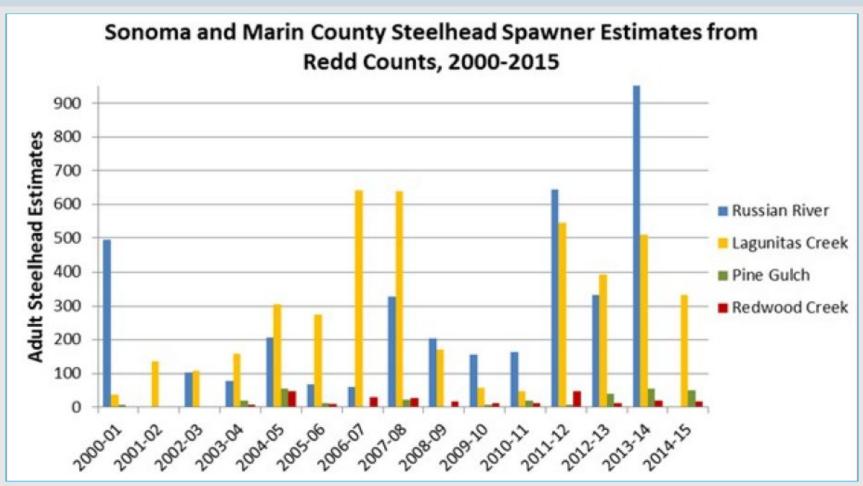

### Juvenile Steelhead Size Distribution

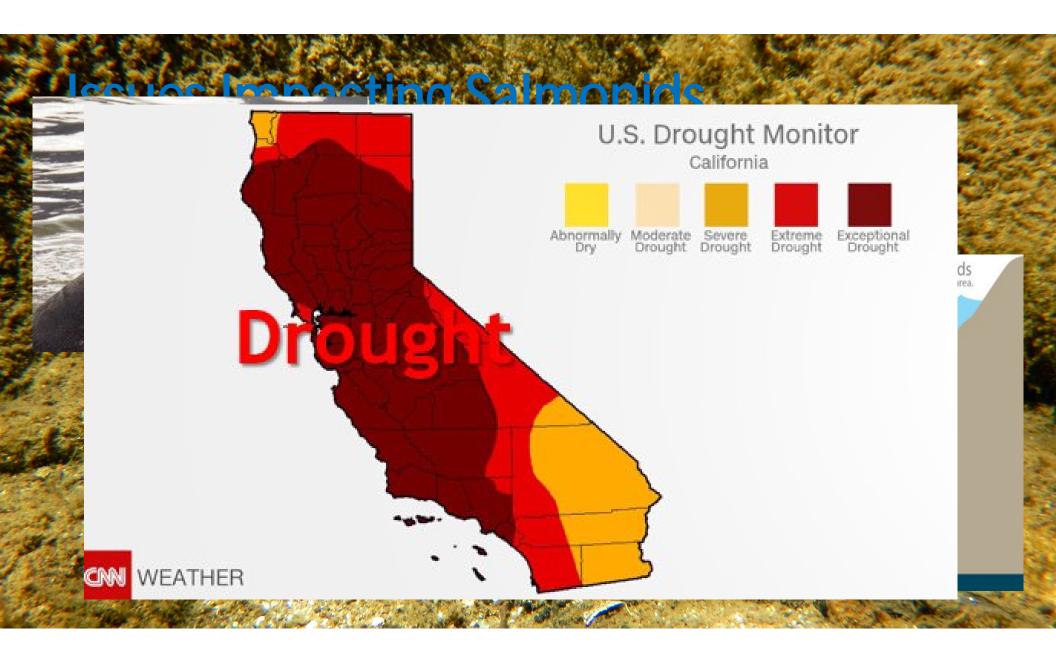

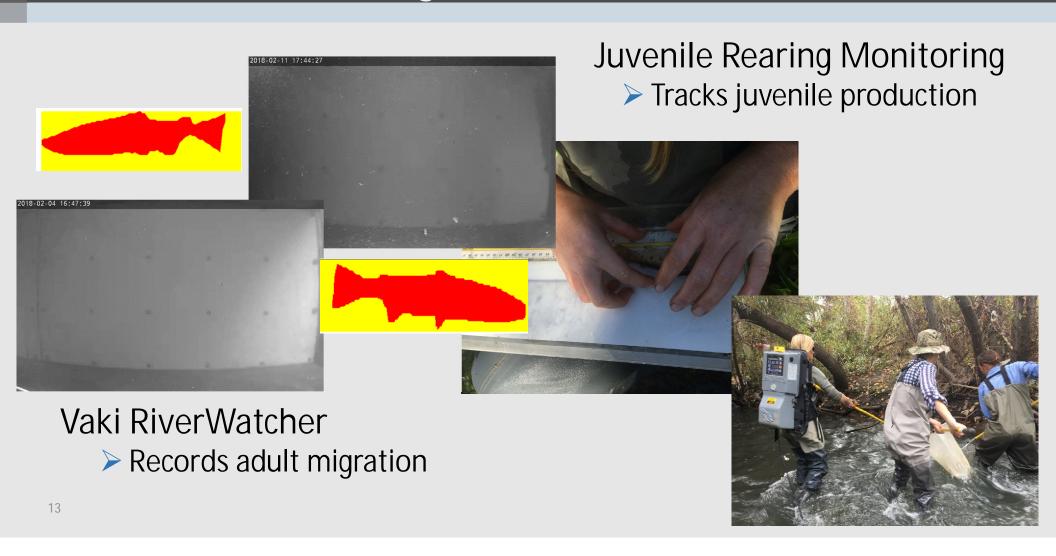
